- a. The hyperlinks are the text (often underlined and coloured) or images that are connected to other documents and enable the user to jump from one web page to another by clicking on them.
- b. There are two types of web browsers, namely, text browsers and graphical browsers. Lynx is an example of a text browser, while Google Chrome is a graphical web browser.
- c. Internet Explorer is a graphical web browser that is developed by Microsoft and included as a part of the Microsoft Windows operating system. To open Internet Explorer, click the Start button on the desktop, select All Programs and then select Internet Explorer.
- d. The Favorites button in the Internet Explorer window enables to save the links of your favourite websites so that you can revisit them later.
- e. [www.google.com](http://www.google.com) and [www.bing.com](http://www.bing.com).
- f. E-mail is a fast, easy and economical way to communicate with other Internet users around the world. You can send documents, pictures, audio and even video through e-mails.
- g. The Internet contains millions of web pages. To access these pages, you need to have their addresses. Each web page has a unique address called a URL (Uniform Resource Locator), which enables the web browser to locate that web page on the Internet.
